The Bayh College of Education is pleased to announce the **2012 Paul A. Kinser Faculty Development Award in Education**. This award is designed to recognize the good work of a tenured or tenured-track faculty member in the Bayh College of Education that has exhibited exemplary citizenship of service to her/his department, the College, its students, and/or her/his profession and its professional organizations. Exceptional service in at least two of the areas is required. The award is being offered and funded through an endowment established by Dr. Paul A. Kinser.

Award: The \$1,000 award is designed to provide professional development support for the selected recipient and may be used for such activities as attendance at a professional conference, membership dues in professional organizations, purchase of professional books or subscriptions, or purchase of other supplies and materials needed to conduct professional activities. The award must be expended by April 30, 2013. All unused funds shall be returned to the award pool.

Application: Complete a letter of application that includes a description of the citizenship of service completed during the 2011 calendar year, noting outcomes of expanding service to individuals, the department, the College, its students, and/or the profession and evidence of contribution, leadership, and collaboration with others to accomplish the activity. Up to 10 pages of support materials may accompany the application that includes letters of support, notes of appreciation for the service, etc.

Due Date: Applications are to be submitted to Shelia Weir in the dean's office by **February 15, 2012**. A committee appointed by the dean will review applications and make a recommendation for the award to the Dean. Announcement and presentation of the award will be made at the Honor's Day Program on April 25, 2012.
